Good Morning Kenny,

We have worked up the projected irrigation supply from Harlan County Lake using the storage available on April 30, 2007. This number is used when determining "Water-Short Year Administration". The estimated supply was 56,300 acre-feet at that time with a split of 30,600 acre-feet to Bostwick in Nebraska and 25,700 acre-feet to Kansas Bostwick. As you can see the percentage of the split is beginning to change because contract efficiencies would now result in water being moved to acres below Lovewell (approximately eight inch supply for all acres).

As for today, we have gained approximately 1,200 acre-feet in Harlan County Lake since yesterday morning which would result in a split of around 26,300 acre-feet to Kansas Bostwick and 31,200 to Bostwick in Nebraska. The supply will continue to increase for a while as the inflow to Harlan County (USGS gage) remains above 450 cfs this morning but is gradually dropping.
