Chris and Shawn Holovach as owners of the referenced files have filed applications for approval to change the place of use and use made of water for operation as dual use from irrigation to authorize irrigation and stockwater uses. The applications located in the White Woman Creek Basin, Scott County were received on December 28, 2022.

The referenced files appear to comply with K.S.A. 82a-718, *Abandonment of water rights* and K.S.A. 82a-732, *Annual water use report required; penalty for violations*, as reports have been received. Notice per K.S.A. 82a-1906, *Notice...*, has been sent. The applications comply with K.A.R. 5-5-2a, *Complete change application*.

The owners are requesting a change in use made of water per K.A.R. 5-5-9, *Criteria for the approval of an application for a change in the use made of water from irrigation to any other type of beneficial use of water,* to authorize a limited "dual use" of irrigation and stockwatering from a shared well. These files have a complete overlap in point of diversion and place of use. The place of use change will add the livestock feedlot facility operated by Lee Mayo on behalf of HRC Feedyards LLC. My conversation with Chris Holovach indicated there is a contract water use agreement between the owners and HRC Feedyard LLC. All owners signed the applications and provided needed information for their completion.

File No. 473 authorizes 570 gallons per minute (gpm) to divert 225 acre-feet (AF) from one(1) well located near the center of the Southeast Quarter (SW¼) of Section 17, Township 17 South, Range 33 West, Scott County. File No. 15,818, shares this well providing 95 AF at 600 gpm, with their combined 320 AF irrigating 160 acres in the same quarter. Scott County consumptive use allocation of 81.8% affords the dual use quantity under the referenced files to be 261.76 AF (85.295 million gallons (mgy)) per year. Their rates of diversion will remain as authorized. Specifically, while operated as dual use, File No. 473 will be authorized 184.1 AF, and File No. 15,818, authorized 77.7 AF.

The reduction in quantity and modification of the limitation assures compliance with K.A.R. 5-5-3, *Change in consumptive use*.

The irrigated place of use of 160 acres at the reduced quantity of 261.76 AF will provide an irrigation ratio of 1.63 AF/acre. This is more than the Scott County Net Irrigation (NIR) requirement of 1.33 AF/acre at the 80% chance of rainfall per K.A.R. 5-5-12, *Net irrigation requirements*, appearing to remain reasonable.

The proposed 261.76 AF (85.295 mgy) could be diverted as stockwater use at the proposed existing feedlot located in the Northwest Quarter (NW¹/₄) and in the North Half of the Southwest Quarter (N¹/₂ SW¹/₄) of Section 24, in Township 17, South Range 32 West, Scott County. This feedlot is currently authorized by File Nos. 6,974; 8,716.05; 15,772; 17,125.05; 18,123; 32,665.05; 36,173.05 & 38,388 with a total of 73.208 mgy, with full operational wells. This quantity would provide drinking water to 13,371 head at 15 gallons per head per day. An increase to 158.504 mgy could be yielded by the changes. The submitted justification indicates a total of 146.93 mgy could be needed due to cattle numbers and operation of the facility, but also states their stockwater wells have reduced production. No additional limitation on the quantity will be applied due to the justification and well operations. It appears the applications complies with K.A.R. 5-3-22, *Maximum reasonable quantity of water for livestock and poultry*.

The review of the change application identified(2) two wells within one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile of the well proposing to change. One is owned by HRC and the nearby notification letter sent on April 27, 2023, to the other well owner and their water use correspondent did not result in any comments. It appears the processing of the application follows K.S.A. 82a-1906.

Information in the WRIS database indicates the well authorized by both of the referenced files has an actual to be 1,472 feet North and 1,382 feet West of the Southeast corner of Section 17 approximately . The actual location was determined to be approximately 172 feet from the authorized, but complies with K.A.R. 5-5-6, *Failure to construct diversion works at authorized location*, due to the history of the files. The qualifiers with be updated to the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SE¹/₄ NW¹/₄ SE¹/₄) of 17-17-31W, Scott County.

Katie Durham, Manager of Western Kansas Groundwater Management District No. 1, was sent the application and a recommendation requested. No reply was received. It would appear the District has no objections to approval of the applications.

Mike Meyer, Water Commissioner of the Garden City Field Office, indicated that he recommends approval of the applications and temporary reduction per his May 22, 2023, email.

A condition of the approvals will be the requirement of a flow meter for each use authorized, pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-706c. A check valve will be required if chemigation occurs. The water use correspondent will remain Chris & Shawn Holovach, with HRC receiving copies of the approval documents.

Based on the above discussion, that the changes are reasonable, consumptive use will not increase, impairment of existing water rights is unlikely, and that no change in the local source of supply will occur, it is recommended that the referenced application for change be approved.

APPROVAL OF APPLICATION FOR CHANGE IN USE MADE OF WATER, PLACE OF USE AND ORDER IN THE MATTER OF THE AUTHORIZED QUANTITY OF WATER AND BETTER DESCRIBE THE AUTHORIZED POINT OF DIVERSION WATER RIGHT, FILE NO. 473

The Chief Engineer, Division of Water Resources, Kansas Department of Agriculture, after due consideration of the written application of Chris Holovach and Shawn Holovach, 2730 E Road 240, Scott City, Kansas 67871-4152 as owners of the referenced water right, along with Lee Mayo on behalf of HRC Feed Yards LLC, PO Box 224, Scott City, Kansas 67871, received in this office on December 28, 2022, for approval of a change in the location of the place of use and the use made of water under the certificate of appropriation issued pursuant to the permit to appropriate water for beneficial use, as modified and amended by the Order of the Chief Engineer dated February 23, 1971, approving the application to change the place of use, and by the Findings and Order of the Chief Engineer dated October 10, 1979, to better describe the authorized point of diversion, and by the Order of the Chief Engineer dated May 7, 2004, approving the application to change the point of diversion, finds that the change is reasonable and will not impair existing rights, and that the application should be and is hereby approved.

The authorized quantity of water under this right will remain 225 acre-feet (73.31 million gallons). This order effectively limits the authorized quantity of water to 184.1 acre-feet (59.97 million gallons) per calendar year for both stockwatering and irrigation uses combined. That the limitation on the quantity of water shall exist until such a time that the quantity of water for stockwatering use authorized by this approval is no longer required.

The authorized location of the irrigation place of use shall be:

a total of 160 acres in Section 17, Township 17 South, Range 31 West, Scott County, Kansas and the place of use authorized for stockwatering use shall be:

a feedlot located in the Northwest Quarter (NW $\frac{1}{4}$) and the in the North Half of the Southwest Quarter (N $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 24, Township 17 South, Range 32 West, Scott County, Kansas,

all located substantially as shown on the topographic map accompanying the application to change the use made of water and place of use.

That information in the office of the Chief Engineer finds that the point of diversion authorized would more accurately be defined as:

> one (1) well located in the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SE¹/₄ NW¹/₄ SE¹/₄) of Section 17, more particularly described as being near a point 1,472 feet North and 1,382 feet West of the Southeast corner of said section, in Township 17 South, Range 31 West, Scott County, Kansas.

The water right owner shall properly install a separate acceptable water meter for each use made of water for the diversion works authorized under this water right, prior to the use of water, in strict accordance with the Kansas Administrative Regulations 5-1-4 through 5-1-12 adopted by the Chief Engineer. The water right owner shall notify the Chief Engineer when installation of the water meters has been completed. The water right owner shall maintain the water meters in an operating condition satisfactory to the Chief Engineer, at all times during diversion of water and shall maintain records from which the total quantity of water diverted for stockwatering, and irrigation use may be determined. The water right owner shall also report the reading of said water meters and the total quantity of water diverted annually to the Chief Engineer. Such records shall be furnished to the Chief Engineer by March 1 following the end of each calendar year.

All diversion works into which any type of chemical or other foreign substance will be injected into the water pumped from the diversion works shall be equipped with an in-line, automatic, guick-closing check valve capable of preventing pollution of the source of the water supply. The type of valve installed shall meet specifications adopted by the Chief Engineer and shall be maintained in an operating condition satisfactory to the Chief Engineer.

In all other respects, the Certificate of Appropriation issued pursuant to Approval of Application, File No. 473, for permit to appropriate water for beneficial use, is as stated and set forth in the Certificate of Appropriation dated February 2, 1956, as modified and amended by the aforementioned orders.

RIGHT TO A HEARING AND TO ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW

If you are aggrieved by this Order, then pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1901, you may request an evidentiary hearing before the Chief Engineer or request administrative review by the Secretary of Agriculture. Failure to request an evidentiary hearing before the Chief Engineer does not preclude your right to administrative review by the Secretary.

To obtain an evidentiary hearing before the Chief Engineer, a written request for hearing must be filed within 15 days after service of this Order as provided in K.S.A. 77-531 (i.e., within a total of 18 days after this Order was mailed to you), with: Kansas Department of Agriculture, Attn: Legal Section, 1320 Research Park Drive, Manhattan, KS 66502, FAX (785) 564-6777.

If you do not file a request for an evidentiary hearing before the Chief Engineer, you may petition for administrative review of the Order by the Secretary of Agriculture. A petition for review shall be in writing and state the basis for requesting administrative review. The request for hearing may be denied if the request fails to clearly establish factual or legal issues for review. See K.S.A. 77-527. The petition must be filed within 30 days after service of this Order as provided in K.S.A. 77-531 (i.e., within a total of 33 days after this Order was mailed to you), and be filed with: Secretary of Agriculture, Attn: Legal Division, Kansas Department of Agriculture, 1320 Research Park Drive, Manhattan, Kansas 66502, FAX 785-564-6777.

If neither a request for an evidentiary hearing nor a petition for administrative review is filed as set forth above, then this Order shall be effective and become a final agency action as defined in K.S.A. 77-607(b). Failure to timely request either an evidentiary hearing or administrative review may preclude further judicial review under the Kansas Judicial Review Act.
