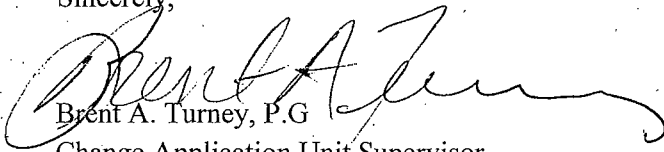

Bryan Dake filed the above referenced applications to appropriate groundwater for irrigation use on November 9, 2015 and December 3, 2015, respectively. Both original applications were returned to the applicant on December 14, 2016 with the request for additional information. The application was given a deadline of January 16, 2017 to return the applications with stratigraphic logs of a test hole within 300 feet of the proposed points of diversion.

No reminder letter was sent regarding these applications; however, I spoke to Mr. Dake over the phone on March 21, 2017 and he indicated that he had no immediate plans to test drill at these locations and would not pursue the applications. The applicant was advised that the applications would be dismissed for failure to return the applications with the requested information.

Based on the available information, that the applications were not returned with the requested information within the time allowed, it is recommended that the files be dismissed for failure to return, as provided by K.S.A. 82a-710.

**FINDINGS AND ORDER
IN THE MATTER OF THE
DISMISSAL OF APPLICATION
FILE NO. 49,500**

After due consideration, the Chief Engineer, Division of Water Resources, Kansas Department of Agriculture (hereinafter referred to as the "Chief Engineer"), makes the following findings and order:

FINDINGS

1. That on November 9, 2015, the Chief Engineer received an application from Bryan Dake for permit to appropriate groundwater for beneficial use, assigned File No. 49,500, proposing the appropriation of 96 acre-feet of water, at a maximum requested diversion rate of 1,200 gallons per minute, for irrigation use. The applicant proposed a well in the Northeast Quarter of Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Section 9, more particularly described as being near a point 4,859 feet North and 3,231 feet West of the Southeast corner of said section, in Township 1 South, Range 2 West, Republic, Kansas.
2. That on December 14, 2016, the application was returned to the applicant, with a cover letter requesting that additional information be submitted in order to complete the application. The applicant was provided a deadline of January 16, 2017, the time in which to provide the requested information and return the application. The applicant was informed that the application would be dismissed if it was not returned with the requested information by the January 16, 2017 deadline, or within any authorized extension of time.
3. That in a March 21, 2017 phone conversation, the applicant indicated to the Topeka Field Office that he could not provide a stratigraphic log and would not be pursuing the application any further.
4. That the requested information was not provided by the January 16, 2017 deadline, nor did the applicant request an extension of time in which to do so.
5. That the application should be dismissed and its priority forfeited as provided by K.S.A. 82a-710, for failure to return the application with the requested information.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, It is the decision and order of the Chief Engineer, Division of Water Resources, Kansas Department of Agriculture, that effective the date of this order, in accordance with the law, Application, File No. 49,500, is herewith dismissed and the priority assigned to it is considered to be forfeited.

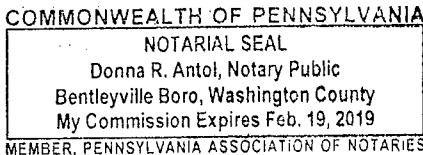

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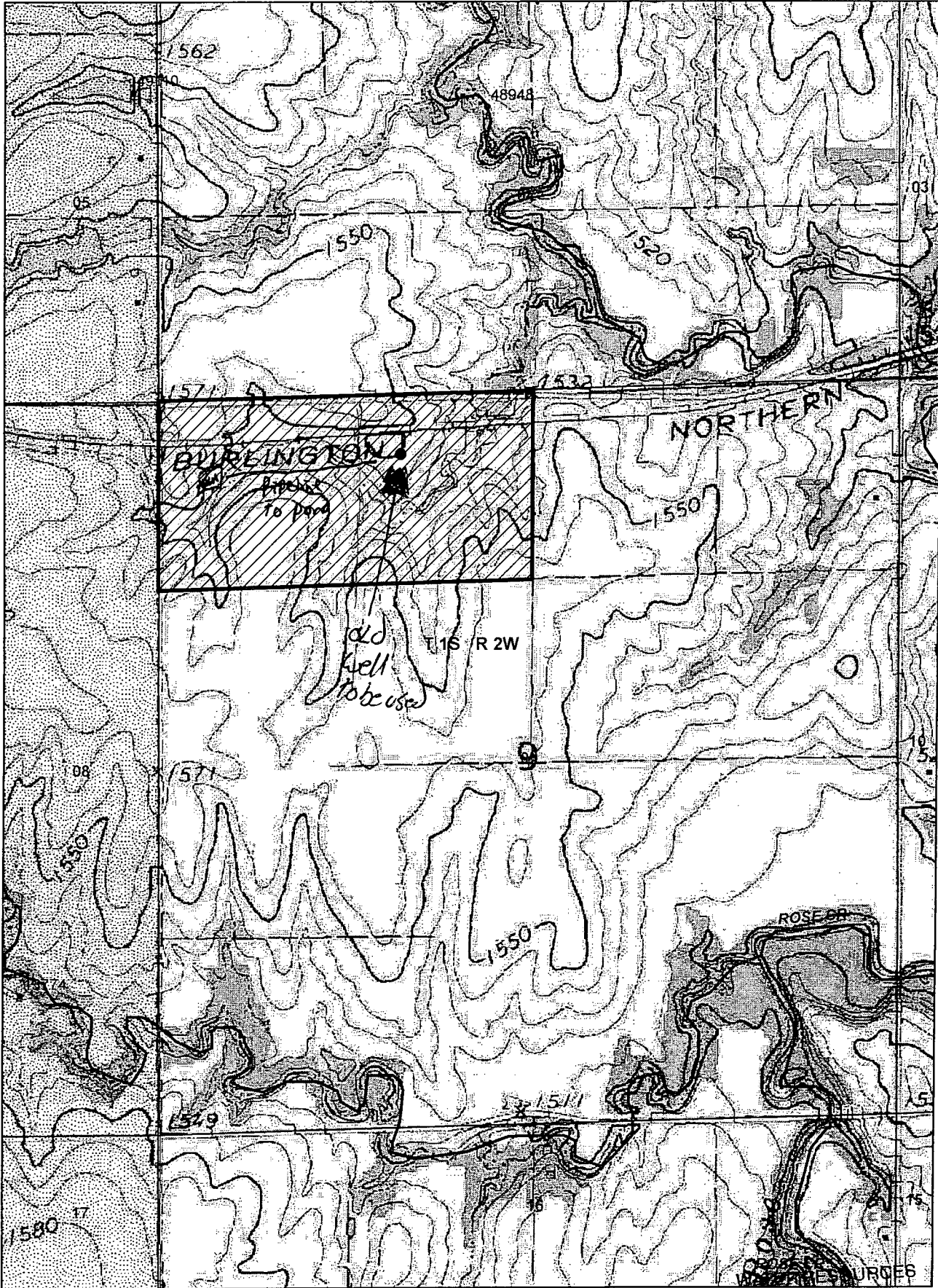

- The fee for an application for a permit to appropriate water for beneficial use, except for domestic use, shall be (see paragraph No. 2 below if requesting storage):

- The fee for an application in which storage is requested, except for domestic use, shall be:

More than 250	\$200.00 plus \$20.00 for each additional 250 acre-feet of storage or any part thereof.

Note: If an application requests both direct use *and* storage, the fee charged shall be as determined under No. 1 or No. 2 above, whichever is greater, but not both fees.

- The fee for an application for a permit to appropriate water for water power or dewatering purposes shall be \$100.00 plus \$200.00 for each 100 cubic feet per second, or part thereof, of the diversion rate requested.

Note: The applicant shall notify the Chief Engineer and pay the statutorily required field inspection fee of \$400.00 when construction of the works for diversion has been completed, except that for applications filed on or after July 1, 2009, for works constructed for sediment control use and for evaporation from a groundwater pit for industrial use shall be accompanied by a field inspection fee of \$200.00.

MAKE CHECKS PAYABLE TO THE KANSAS DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

ATTENTION

A Water Conservation Plan may be required per K.S.A. 82a-733. A statement that your application for permit to appropriate water may be subject to the minimum desirable streamflow requirements per K.S.A. 82a-703a, b, and c may also be required from you. After the Division of Water Resources has had the opportunity to review your application, you will be notified whether or not you will need to submit a Water Conservation Plan. You also may be required to install a water flow meter or water stage measuring device on your diversion works prior to diverting water. There may be other special conditions or Groundwater Management District regulations that you will need to comply with if this application is approved.

Dear Sir or Madam:

Your application for permit to appropriate water in 9-1S-2W in Republic County, was received and has been assigned the file number noted above.

As a matter of record, the Division of Water Resources has on hand a large number of applications awaiting processing. Therefore to be fair to all concerned, and so that we can process those applications on hand in the order they were received, we intend to concentrate on the backlog of applications until the issue is resolved. Once review of your application has begun, we will contact you, if additional information is required.

In accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Water Appropriation Act, a portion of which is included below, the use of water as proposed prior to approval of the application is unlawful. Once approved, compliance with the terms, conditions and limitations of the permit is necessary. Conservation of the water resources of Kansas is required.

Section 82a-728 of the Kansas Water Appropriation Act, provides (a) except for the appropriation of water for the purpose of domestic use, . . . it shall be unlawful for any person to appropriate or threaten to appropriate water from any source without first applying for and obtaining a permit to appropriate water in accordance with the provisions of the Water Appropriation Act or for any person to violate any condition of a vested right, appropriation right or an approved application for a permit to appropriate water for beneficial use.

(b) (1) The violation of any provision of this section by any person is a class C misdemeanor . . .

A class C misdemeanor is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500 and/or a term of confinement not to exceed one month in the county jail. Each day that the violation occurs constitutes a separate offense.
