<u>MEMORANDUM</u>

Jeff Pierpoint has filed the above referenced application proposing to appropriate 20 acre-feet of surface water by direct diversion at a rate of 1,500 gallons per minute from the Verdigris River at two existing pump sites for irrigation use. The application is designed to allow water to be pumped from the stream (when water is available) into an off-stream storage device (tail water pit) for subsequent re-diversion for irrigation use. The direct diversion of water will be conducted during the off-season months from October 1 through June 30. The two pump sites are located in the Northwest Quarter of Section 3, and the Northeast Quarter of Section 4, both in Township 28 South, Range 15 East, Wilson County, Kansas.

The proposed points of diversion include two of the three pump sites authorized by Water Right, File No. 5,627, (one of which is also authorized by Water Right, File No. 22,992), both owned by the applicant. The applicant has signed the application form stating he has legal access to, or control of, the points of diversion. File Nos. 5,627; 5,627-B; 22,992; 48,620; and 48,621 all overlap in place of use with the pending application. The proposed place of use (637 acres) is partially owned by the applicant, and partially owned by Pierpoint Farms, Inc.

File No. 5,627 is authorized 86.9 acre-feet; File No. 5,627-B is authorized 91 acre-feet; File No. 22,992 is authorized 154 acre-feet; File No. 48,620 is authorized 121.8 acre-feet; and File No. 48,621 is authorized 56.7 acre-feet. These senior files provide a combined total quantity of 510.4 acre-feet. The requested quantity of water to be diverted (20 acre-feet) combined with the senior files would be 530.4 acre-feet. This is less than the maximum quantity of water considered to be reasonable to irrigate 637 acres in Wilson County, as provided by K.A.R. 5-3-24 (1 AF/ac X 637 ac. = 637 AF). Therefore, no limitations are required on this junior file.

Notification letters were sent to upstream and downstream landowners on January 10, 2019. No responses of any kind were received. The WRIS database indicates that there are several other surface water diversions on the Verdigris River within a 2-mile radius of the proposed pump sites, most are owned by the applicant. The applicant owns all of the downstream points of diversion within 2 miles, and the nearest of his pump sites is located over 1,800 feet away. Approval of this application, conditioned with standard permit conditions, will not impair any existing water rights. The applicant has a pending senior file for surface water (File No. 49,551) but it is located on a tributary stream, for a different irrigation project, and would not be affected by approval of this junior file.

Per K.A.R 5-3-15, the application will be subject to specific conditions, which stipulate strict requirements for direct surface water diversion. These conditions include the stipulation that no diversion shall occur unless there is water available to satisfy all demands by senior water rights and permits; written or verbal permission from the Chief Engineer, or an authorized representative is required prior to diverting water; and streamflow cannot be stopped at the first riffle below the point of diversion while diversion is taking place.

The application also complies with K.A.R 5-3-15 (c)(5) as there is no need for direct diversion of water from July 1 through September 30 because the existing off-stream storage device (tail water pit) will provide adequate water storage.

In accordance with K.S.A. 82a-706c, the Chief Engineer retains full authority to require any water user to install meters, gages, or other measuring devices, which devices he or she or his or her agents may read at any time. Water flowmeter requirements are further described in K.A.R. 5-1-4 through K.A.R 5-1-12. If any chemical or foreign substance is injected into the water pumped under this permit, a check valve will also need to be installed.

Katie Tietsort, Water Commissioner, Topeka Field Office, recommended that the referenced application be approved in a January 22, 2019 discussion.

Based on the above discussion, the area is open to new appropriations meeting certain criteria, the proposed use is designed to take advantage of off-season stream flows, an off-stream water storage device is available, and approval of the application will not impair senior water rights nor prejudicially or unreasonably affect the public interest, it is recommended that the referenced application be approved.

for a permit to appropriate water for beneficial use, together with the maps, plans and other submitted data, and that the application is hereby approved and the applicant is hereby authorized, subject to vested rights and prior appropriations, to proceed with the construction of the proposed diversion works (except those dams and stream obstructions regulated by K.S.A. 82a-301 through 305a, as amended), and to proceed with all steps necessary for the application of the water to the approved and proposed beneficial use and otherwise perfect the proposed appropriation subject to the following terms, conditions and limitations:

- 1. That the priority date assigned to such application is January 29, 2018.
- 2. That the water sought to be appropriated shall be used for irrigation use on land described in the application, as follows:

- 3. That the authorized source from which the appropriation shall be made is surface water from the Verdigris River, to be diverted by means of two (2) pump sites located as follows: one (1) pump site located in the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest of the Northwest Quarter (SW½ SW½ NW½) of Section 3, more particularly described as being near a point 2,712 feet North and 5,151 feet West of the Southeast corner of said section, and one (1) pump site located in the Northeast Quarter of the Southwest of the Northeast Quarter (NE½ SW½ NE½) of Section 4, more particularly described as being near a point 3,934 feet North and 1,556 feet West of the Southeast corner of said section, all in Township 28 South, Range 15 East, Wilson County, Kansas, located substantially as shown on the topographic map accompanying the application.
- 4. That the appropriation sought shall be limited to a maximum diversion rate not in excess of 1,500 gallons per minute (3.34 c.f.s.) and to a quantity not to exceed 20 acre-feet of water for any calendar year.

- 5. That installation of works for diversion of water shall be completed on or before <u>December 31, 2022</u> or within any authorized extension thereof. The applicant shall notify the Chief Engineer and pay the statutorily required field inspection fee, which is currently \$400.00, when construction of the works has been completed. Failure to timely submit the notice and the fee will result in revocation of the permit. Any request for an extension of time shall be submitted prior to the expiration of the deadline and shall be accompanied by the required statutory fee, which is currently \$100.00.
- 6. That the proposed appropriation shall be perfected by the actual application of water to the proposed beneficial use on or before <u>December 31, 2026</u> or any authorized extension thereof. Any request for an extension of time shall be submitted prior to the expiration of the deadline and shall be accompanied by the required statutory fee, which is currently \$100.00.
- 7. That the applicant shall not be deemed to have acquired a water appropriation for a quantity in excess of the amount approved herein nor in excess of the amount found by the Chief Engineer to have been actually used for the approved purpose during one calendar year subsequent to approval of the application and within the time specified for perfection or any authorized extension thereof.
- 8. That the use of water herein authorized shall not be made so as to impair any use under existing water rights nor prejudicially and unreasonably affect the public interest.
- 9. That the right of the appropriator shall relate to a specific quantity of water and such right must allow for a reasonable raising or lowering of the static water level and for the reasonable increase or decrease of the streamflow at the appropriator's point of diversion.
- 10. That this permit does not constitute authority under K.S.A. 82a-301 through 305a to construct any dam or other obstruction; nor does it grant any right-of-way, or authorize entry upon or injury to, public or private property.
- 11. That all diversion works constructed under the authority of this permit into which any type of chemical or other foreign substance will be injected into the water pumped from the diversion works shall be equipped with an in-line, automatic quick-closing, check valve capable of preventing pollution of the source of the water supply. The type of valve installed shall meet specifications adopted by the Chief Engineer and shall be maintained in an operating condition satisfactory to the Chief Engineer.
- 12. That an acceptable water flow meter shall be installed and maintained on the diversion works authorized by this permit in accordance with the Kansas Administrative Regulations 5-1-4 through 5-1-12 adopted by the Chief Engineer. This water flow meter shall be used to provide an accurate quantity of water diverted as required for the annual water use report (including the meter reading at the beginning and end of the report year).
- 13. That the applicant shall maintain accurate and complete records from which the quantity of water diverted during each calendar year may be readily determined and the applicant shall file an annual water use report with the Chief Engineer by March 1 following the end of each calendar year. Failure to file the annual water use report by the due date shall cause the applicant to be subject to a civil penalty.
- 14. That the stream flow shall not be stopped at the first riffle below the point of diversion while diversion is taking place under the authority of this water right or permit.

- 15. That no water user shall engage in nor allow the waste of any water diverted under the authority of this permit.
- 16. That failure without cause to comply with provisions of the permit and its terms, conditions and limitations will result in the forfeiture of the priority date, revocation of the permit and dismissal of the application.
- 17. That the right to appropriate water under authority of this permit is subject to any minimum desirable streamflow requirements identified and established pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-703c for the source of supply to which this water right applies.
- 18. That during the period July 1 through September 30 each calendar year, no direct diversions of surface water shall be permitted unless written permission is obtained from the Chief Engineer, or the Chief Engineer's authorized representative.
- 19. That during the period October 1 through June 30, the verbal or written permission of the Chief Engineer, or an authorized representative of the Chief Engineer, shall be obtained in order to divert water each time the applicant desires to divert water.

Reports submitted in paper form will be assessed a \$20 per file number paper filing fee. In order to avoid this filing fee, you may submit your report online at www.kswaterusereport.org.

The approval of your application constitutes a permit to appropriate water. It does not give authority to construct any dam or other stream obstruction regulated by K.S.A. 82a-301 through 305a. It does not give authority to access any right-of-way or authorize trespassing upon or injury to public or private property. It may also be necessary for you to comply with other local, state or federal requirements.

Enclosed is an informational sheet that sets forth the procedure to obtain a Certificate of Appropriation which will establish the extent of your perfected water right. RIGHT TO A HEARING AND TO ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW

If you are aggrieved by this Order, then pursuant to K.S.A. 82a-1901, you may:

- 1) request an evidentiary hearing before the Chief Engineer, or
- 2) request administrative review by the Secretary of Agriculture.

Failure to request an evidentiary hearing before the Chief Engineer does not preclude your right to administrative review by the Secretary.

To obtain an evidentiary hearing before the Chief Engineer, a written request for hearing must be filed within 15 days after service of this Order as provided in K.S.A. 77-531 (i.e., within a total of 18 days after this Order was mailed to you), with: Kansas Department of Agriculture, Attn: Legal Section, 1320 Research Park Drive, Manhattan, Kansas 66502, FAX (785) 564-6777.

If you do not file a request for an evidentiary hearing before the Chief Engineer, you may petition for administrative review of the Order by the Secretary of Agriculture. A petition for review shall be in writing and state the basis for requesting administrative review. The request for hearing may be denied if the request fails to clearly establish factual or legal issues for review. See K.S.A. 77-527. The petition must be filed within 30 days after service of this Order as provided in K.S.A. 77-531 (i.e., within a total of 33 days after this Order was mailed to you), and be filed with: Secretary of Agriculture, Attn: Legal Division, Kansas Department of Agriculture, 1320 Research Park Drive, Manhattan, Kansas 66502, FAX (785) 564-6777.

If neither a request for an evidentiary hearing nor a petition for administrative review is filed as set forth above, then this Order shall be effective and become a final agency action as defined in K.S.A. 77-607(b). Failure to timely request either an evidentiary hearing or administrative review may preclude further judicial review under the Kansas Judicial Review Act.
