PUBLIC HEARING

Chairman Haag called the public hearing to order at 7:08 p.m. The agenda and roster were circulated to those present.

OFFICIAL NOTICE OF THIS PUBLIC HEARING WAS PUBLISHED NOT LESS THAN TEN DAYS PRIOR TO THE HEARING IN THE NORTH PLATTE TELEGRAPH AND THE MCCOOK GAZETTE. INDIVIDUALS INVOLVED IN THE HEARING WERE NOTIFIED BY MAIL.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The purpose of this hearing is to hear requests for a variance from the rules and regulations for the Temporary Suspension of the Drilling of New Wells and other applicable rules and regulations of the District.

Kelly Wertz arrived at 7:10p.m.

TESTIMONY

Baker Corp. has requested a variance to drill an industrial well. Smith reviewed the request. The original wells constructed at the plant site do not provide enough water to allow for backup if one of those wells should have problems. Baker Corp. had agreed to allow the plant to use an irrigation well on the nearby property. This well was changed in use to an industrial well but the Dept. of Natural Resources was reluctant in allowing them to replace that well. They now are requesting a new well and will not use the old well.

Mike Baker offered testimony. The well will be used by the Trenton ethanol plant and will be located in the northwest quarter of section 7-3-32 in Hitchcock Co. This area has lower nitrates then the wells they are currently using and would help improve the quality of the water that is currently being used. Pumping would not increase.

Lincoln Farms, which is owned by Donald & Jodi Oppliger, has requested a variance for certifying acres. A copy of the certification request as well as a map of the area was handed out. This request was considered in March and denied. Smith reviewed the current rules concerning certifying acres. Donald Oppliger, Lincoln Farms, offered testimony. The well was used for irrigation from 1974-1998 to irrigate a field that was located where the feedlot is now located. It has not been used since this time. They would like to irrigate ground west of feedlot with this well. The ground they want to irrigate is currently rangeland and has never been irrigated. The well is not currently metered but

would be if acres are approved. The well is registered as active but carried as unused with the District. Discussion was held on recorder well readings in the area.

Chairman Haag closed the hearing at 7:28 p.m.

REGULAR MEETING

The regular monthly board meeting was called to order by Gayle Haag at 7:04 p.m. The agenda and roster were circulated to those present.

Items added to the agenda: 12d1) Spring Water Levels

Official notice of the regular monthly meeting was published in the North Platte Telegraph and the McCook Daily Gazette and was posted in the NRD office and on the District Website at www.mrnrd.org. As a courtesy it was also announced on local radio stations.

MINUTES

The minutes for the regular board meeting and public hearing on March 9, 2004 were presented. Wayne Madsen noted that Connie Jo Discoe's name was misspelled on the regular meeting and public hearing minutes.

A motion was made by Fornoff and second by Roberts to approve the minutes for the March public hearing and regular board meeting and as corrected.

Recessed meeting at 7:07 p.m. for hearing. Kelly Wertz arrived at 7:10p.m.

Reconvened meeting at 7:28 p.m.

CONSIDER VARIANCE REQUEST

Variances for 4 wells were granted when plans were being made for the ethanol plant. Only 3 wells were drilled and registered.

A motion was made by Madsen and second by Harsh to grant variance for Baker well with the condition that G051715B be decommissioned and reported to DNR by November 1, 2004.

Anderjaska addressed concerns with certifying acres for ground that is currently grass. The well has history but the ground does not. Discussion was held on the effect of allowing these new acres. A motion was made by Anderjaska and second by Wertz to deny the certify acres to Don Oppliger, for the well in section 11-10-33 registration number G-040467.

LEGAL MATTERS

Smith updated board on cases. Potter has filed for extensions.

FINANCIAL ACTIONS

The financial report for March was presented. The County Treasurer's Balance was \$16,086.56. Smith reviewed reports.

♦ A motion was made by Anderjaska and second by Dodson to approve the February financial report as presented.

The monthly budget comparison was presented and reviewed. A summary of the lawsuit settlement funds was also mailed to Directors.

OPEN FORUM

Claude Cappel discussed pumping water to places where domestic wells were running dry. He has had to do this in the Perry area do to several homes in the area not having any water. The water was pumped down a portion of the field and allowed to soak into the ground. This recharged the groundwater providing water to these homes within 48 hours of pumping. 18 acre-feet was run down the field to recharge these wells. Cappel thinks that artificial recharge needs to be considered when new rules are adopted.

Cappel handed out reports that showed acres certified with FSA in 1998-2003. Cappel also provided acres that are taxed as irrigated by the County Assessors. Cappel also circulated a report showing surface water levels as wells were drilled. An SMS Layer showing the efficiency of having the water applied below the top of the crop instead of having it spray over top was circulated. Cappel reported a significant reduction in the bushels produced on a section of the field that had water applied above the top of the crop.

Kurt Pieper asked the board where things stand concerning allocations. The plan is to hold a hearing no later than August concerning allocations. The options currently being looked at are an allocation, reduction in acres, or a combination of the two. In 2003 the District overused approximately 35,000 acre-feet. 2004 is anticipated to put us an additional 40,000 behind. Smith reviewed the process the District has to go through to calculate what needs to be done. The District hopes to have an incentive program in place before 2005 to help decrease irrigated acres. Pieper questioned what the measuring stick for determining compliance. Smith reviewed the computations that go into determining compliance. Discussion was held on how District lines for different NRDs were determined. The District is currently working on a joint action plan with DNR. Pieper questioned whether a 2 feet decline in Lincoln County is a significant decline. The area that he is referring to has seen a decline 5 of the last 6 years.

Pieper stated that he does not believe the whole District should be treated the same when limits are placed for the settlement compliance. All areas will have an impact on the river some areas impact

occurs sooner then others. Smith indicated that the Compact drives a lot of the decisions made by the District. Smith discussed the consideration of allowing allocations to be rolled over (banking water). Smith also discussed triggers defined in the settlement. Banking may be allowed to an extent but in water short years the banked water may not be available to be used. The District is looking at incentive programs for taking irrigation acre out of production. Smith reviewed some of the programs being considered.

Questions were asked concerning buying water. Discussion was held on those that have already been practicing conservation and whether they would be treated any differently. Smith reviewed the issue of consumptive use, which is the figure that is used in the Compact calculation. Consumptive use, not just overall use, has to be decreased. Smith reviewed the current timeline before a plan is approved.

NRCS REPORT

Dave Griffith gave a report on NRCS activities. 175 applications have been received for EQIP. Signup ends April 16, 2004. Rankings have to be sent to Lincoln by June 1, 2004. Griffith hopes to have an allocation of EQIP funds by the May board meeting. Griffith discussed the CREP program and the process required to get this program in the Republican Basin. The proposed area currently is within 2 miles of the river and 1 mile of the tributaries. The District should know by August if the area is going to be approved.

NARD

LB962 is on final reading. Anderjaska reported that insurance had a better month in March. 18 Districts agreed to pay the \$500 per employee assessment. Changes to the insurance plan are still being considered. Deductible on insurance will probably increase to \$1500. There will also be changes to vision and dental insurance. If 100% of the employees of the Districts that participate in the plan would take the Association insurance, this would help decrease the premiums. Envirothon is looking for assistance. It is scheduled for May 8, 2004. Association's next meeting is scheduled for June 21, 2004.

Smith reviewed the proposed budget. There is currently no increase in dues planned.

NACD

E-notes for 3-30-04 and 4-6-04 were mailed to Directors.

NNRC

The next meeting is May 20, 2004. Madsen reported that funds are still available for meter cost share.

INFORMATION & EDUCATION

The Information & Education Activities report was mailed to Directors. Griffith reviewed the report. Griffith is working with the Upper Republican to develop a Groundwater Festival for this area. The District has nominated the John Sullivan family for the Omaha World Herald Master Conservation Award. Nomination forms for the District's Honor Conservation awards have been sent out. These applications are due in by May 3rd and will be considered at the May meeting. Griffith reviewed the NERain program. The program will distribute one rain gauge to each township in the program area. The group is looking for volunteers to put out rain gauges and then read the gauge and report the readings.

Griffith reviewed applications for the District college scholarship. Three applications were received. Matt Klima and Clarissa Nutt both applied for scholarships to NCTA. Elizabeth Stahla applied for a scholarship to McCook Community College.

♦ A motion was made by Harsh and second by Fornoff to approve Matt Klima for the NCTA scholarship and Elizabeth Stahley for the McCook Community College scholarship and to approve Clarissa Nutt as the alternate.

NEBRASKA REPUBLICAN RIVER MANAGEMENT DISTRICTS ASSOC.

The last meeting was scheduled for April 5. Smith reported on the meeting. 4 of the power districts are working together to do an economic impact study of controls that may be put in place. The next meeting will be July 22, 2004 in Alma. The results of the impact study will be reported on the afternoon of the 22nd.

OTHER AGENCIES OR ASSOCIATIONS

Rural Development held a meeting on April 1st with the communities concerning their proposed water systems. Smith reported on this meeting. Haag, Madsen, and Smith attended the meeting. The communities have chosen to not have the NRD involved at this time.

There is a riparian project meeting April 15, 2004 in Oberlin. This is a project started by RC&D.

LEGISLATION

NARD updates were circulated. Governor wants the task force members to come to Lincoln the 15th for the signing of LB962 if it passes.

GROUND WATER MANAGEMENT

The well permits report was handed out at the meeting. One application for a replacement well has been received.

Smith reviewed letters received from the City of McCook. McCook wanted to know what they would need to do if they decide to drill wells on the south side of the community. The City is also considering drilling a well for the 20 acre cemetery to give it an independent water supply. Smith reviewed a meeting held March 24, 2004 involving the Middle Republican NRD and the Lower Republican NRD. Smith reviewed recommendations this group made for common goals to be addressed by the two Districts. A copy of the recommendations is on file with the minutes. Smith reviewed various meetings held in March. Smith has had discussions with DNR concerning the number of acres being used for the Middle Republican NRD. The next facilitated meeting between all the Districts in the Basin and DNR is scheduled for April 20, 2004 in Cambridge. Discussion was held on whether to have a Groundwater Committee meeting or a special board meeting prior to the May Board meeting.

Smith reviewed issues that the District needs to take a position on before the April 20, 2004 meeting.

- 1) Does the District want to look at a 5 or 10% reduction in pumping from the baseline? This is a reduction that would be taken by all Districts.
- 2) Does the District want to look at an additional allocation or reduction in pumping during water-short years?

Discussion was held concerning funds for retiring acres.

Smith reviewed a report mailed to Directors concerning allocation considerations. Smith presented a proposal for allocation for the Directors to consider. This report had suggestions for parameters the Directors may want to consider. Smith requested that the Directors give him some guidance of what the Directors want to consider. He can then take this decision to the April 20 meeting. A copy of this proposal is on file with the minutes. Smith reviewed reports showing irrigated acres according to NASS and according to the District's records. An alternate proposal giving a base allocation of 10" was also discussed. This proposal would allow people to purchase an additional allocation. Revenue from this plan could be used to pay for buy out of irrigated land. Discussion was held concerning the various proposals and what options are available for water-short years.

The notes from the March 29, 2004 facilitated meeting was handed out to Directors.

• A motion was made by Harsh and second by Dodson to approve presenting the proposal presented by Smith to DNR but use 16 inches and a 10% reduction in pumping.

Thank you for bringing the issue of the water wells drilled on property within the Middle Republican Natural Resource District in violation of its moratorium to the attention of the Board.

After conducting an investigation into this matter it was determined that there was insufficient evidence to prove that a violation of the Water Well Standards and Contractors Licensing Act and its regulations had occurred in relation to the construction of the water wells.

We share your concern over the apparent violation of the moratorium and the Middle Republican Natural Resource District permitting process by the landowner. However, the Water Well Standards and Contractors Licensing Act and its regulations does not authorize a disciplinary action against a licensee based on this type of violation by either the landowner or a licensee.
