Title I of the Reclamation States Emergency Drought Relief Act of 1991 provides broad authority to the Secretary of the Interior to utilize the facilities of the Federal Reclamation program and the resources of the Department of the Interior to address drought conditions in the western States.

Section 104 of the Act says in part; "The programs and authorities established under this title shall become operative in any Reclamation State only after the Governor of the affected State has made a request for temporary drought assistance and the Secretary, or his appointee, has determined that such temporary assistance is merited..."

Pursuant to Section 104 of the Act, I am requesting temporary drought assistance to my State of Nebraska and urge that you determine that such assistance is merited. The resources of my Office and my State stand ready to assist you in making such a determination.
