Semi-Annual Program Performance Agreement 03FC601826 Improved Hydrologic Data Collection Sytems for Drought Monitoring September 27, 2004

A) Comparison of Actual Accomplishments with Goals and Objectives

Assistance for Republican Irrigation Districts

This category is for funds granted in calendar year 2005. As of the time of this report NDNR has received billing and is paying \$18,000 for H and RW Irrigation District and \$13,700 for Frenchman Valley Irrigation District. Frenchman Cambridge Irrigation District and Nebraska Bostwick Irrigation District have not yet returned signed subcontracts or billings but they are expected soon.

Improved Distribution of Streamflow Information via the Internet

a) Upgrade six Big Blue, Two Platte, six Ord, and four Norfolk gages to DCPs.

This activity was completed during the reporting period and the full budget was expended:

b) Purchase DCS processing tool kit

Work on this item was completed prior to this six month period.

c) Hydrological Data Manager Administrative Package

This item was completed prior to this six month period

d) Server to house hydro manager software and data

This item was completed prior to this six month period

e) Consulting contract on web page upgrade and data collection

Work has not been initiated on this item. This is due to two factors: 1) Difficulties in adoption of the WISKI water data manager software program earlier purchased through drought funds and 2) In house work that has occurred on web application development. In combination these mean that a strong need has developed for software training while we have largely been able to address web questions within house staff. The decision is to be made in the next few weeks on whether to stay with the WISKI program. However, at this time is appears possible or likely that we will stay with the program but hope to spend the funds with permission in this category for specialized training on the WISKI water data manager software. Without that software, the work already done in-house or web development for WISKI would probably be mostly wasted.

Equip DNR with Flow Measurement Equipment

a) Two ultrasonic flow meters

The order has been placed on these flow meters and we have received an invoice, however, we have not received the flow meters. Therefore, there is no billing included with this document. This has become a very frustrating situation for our agency as the order was placed last spring and the supplier keeps telling us they are about to be shipped. We will hopefully be receiving the flow meters and billing this in the near future.

b) One dopler meter for the Lincoln Field Office

This item was completed prior to this six month period

c) Three Aqua Cales

This item was completed prior to this six month period.

Upgrade Gaging Equipment in the Republican Basin

a) Five satellite links

This item was completed prior to this six month period.

b) Walking Bridge at Cambridge and ladder at Medicine Creek

This item was completed during the reporting period. A total of \$2,086.78 was spent during the period. Total expenditures on these items cam to \$2,372.20 out of \$3,500 budgeted.

Meter Cost Share for the South Platte NRD

A total of \$25,187.98 was expended on this item in this period for which 44 meters were installed. This brings total expenditures on this item to \$72,403.78 out of a budgeted \$100,000. The District has received commitments to install meters which would utilize all of the \$100,000. However, there has not yet been time to have all of those meters installed or billed.

On-Site Computer Capabilities for Surface Water Distribution

Work on this item was completed prior to this six month period.

Place a New Gage on the South Platte River near Paxton

Work on this item has been completed.

Update Drought Mitigation Plan

A total of \$11,511.00 was billed during this period. The subcontractor this item extends to January 31, 2006 and a product should be available at that time.

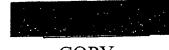

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) has approved the State of Nebraska for drought assistance in 2005 by authority of the Reclamation States Emergency Drought Relief Act of 1991;

WHEREAS, Reclamation has approved drought funding assistance to the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources through Cooperative Agreement No. 03FC601826 ("Cooperative Agreement")(a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A) for a project that will result in additional storage water in drought affected reservoirs in the Republican Basin;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

- 1) The District agrees to:
 - a) not call for 2005 irrigation season storage releases from Enders Reservoir when the lake drops below elevation 3087.90 (12,808 acre feet)
- 2) The Department of Natural Resources agrees to:
 - a) provide financial assistance, which financial assistance shall consist solely of monies received by the Department as 2005 Reclamation Drought Assistance funding ("Federal Funding"), to the District for leaving irrigation supplies in the reservoirs in the amounts specified in Section 1) of this Agreement as follows:
 - For H&RW Irrigation District Operations from Enders Reservoir: that payment for the 2005 irrigation season (leaving the required

amount of storage in the reservoir during the 2005 irrigation season through September 30, 2005) will be \$18,100.

- b) provide payment of the Federal Funding within 60 days of the signature of this Agreement, provided that such Federal Funding has been received by the Department from Reclamation within such time period.
- In the event that inflows exceed estimates, both parties agree that releases of storage water may be made for the benefit of the District, provided, the lake levels remain at or above the levels noted above. Should evaporation or other factors not caused by the District later lower the lake levels noted above, the eligibility of the District for compensation shall not be affected.
- In the event that inflows do not meet estimates and the lake levels do not reach the levels noted above, the level of assistance provided to the District will not be reduced.
- 5) The District and the Department agree as follows:
 - a) to the extent the Department does not receive the Federal Funding, or such funding is disallowed, the Department shall not be obligated to provide the financial assistance referenced in Section 2)a) of this Agreement. The Department's obligation under this agreement is contingent upon the receipt of the Federal Funding from Reclamation from which payment for agreement purposes can be made. No legal liability on the part of the Department for any payment may arise until the Federal Funds are made available to the Department. In the event the Federal Funding is disallowed after the financial assistance referred to in Section 2)a) has been provided to the District, the District agrees to return such funds to the Department.
 - b) the District, on receipt of the financial assistance contemplated by this Agreement, shall be a subrecipient pursuant to the Cooperative Agreement, and agrees to be bound by all of the provisions of the Cooperative Agreement applicable to subrecipients.
- The District shall indemnify and hold the Department harmless from any and all losses, damages, or liability on account of personal injury, death, or property damage, or claims for personal injury, death, or property damage of any nature whatsoever and by whomsoever made, arising out of activities of the District, its employees or agents under this Agreement.
- 7) This agreement may be modified at any time by mutual agreement of the parties.

- 8) Prevailing Law. This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Nebraska including the State Contract Claims Act. (Neb. Rev. Stat. Sections 81-8,302 through 81-8,306.
