Attached is the final request for reimbursement on Agreement No. 03FC601826 for Improved Hydrologic Data Collection Systems for Drought Monitoring as well as a copy of our final report for that project. The request is in the amount of \$23,892.71 and is contained on a form SF 270. I have also enclosed separate sheets providing expenditures to date on the agreement and billings by billing category. Finally, I have included the amounts to each landowner on each meter. Our expenditures by category for the Period of April 4, 2006 to February 8, 2007 were:

One item about the meter cost share being billed is noteworthy. In going through our records of billings for eligible South Platte Meter cost share we found that the amounts we paid on March 22, 2005 were not charged. We have included a sheet providing total billings by meter and sheets breaking out individual meter payments for both the March 22, 2005 billing and the April 4, 2006 to February 8, 2007 periods. March 22, 2005 was the day one previous billing period ended and it appears possible that the amounts may have been entered in our records after the billing amount was calculated earlier in the day.

Jack, I am unsure what you need on the final report, so if you need additional information, please let me know. The final expenditure table included with the report should help explain how funds on the project were expended.

Final Program Performance Report – Agreement 03FC601826 Improved Hydrologic Data Collection Systems for Drought Monitoring

A) Comparison of Actual Accomplishments with Goals and Objectives

Assistance to Republican Irrigation Districts

Reclamation assistance totaling \$151,500 was passed through to four irrigation districts in the Republican River Basin for the 2004 irrigation season and \$169,650 for the 2005 irrigation season. This resulted in those districts not calling for water from Swanson Lake, Hugh Butler Lake, Enders Reservoir and Harlan County Lake when the reservoirs were below specified levels. This in turn provided fish and wildlife and recreation benefits to the area.

Lake McConaughy Water Set Aside

This project paid \$47,310.59 to irrigators that rely on Lake McConaughy surface water not to rely on that water during the 2004 irrigation season thereby leaving more water in the lake as a benefit for recreation, hydropower production, power plant cooling purposes, and fish and wildlife habitat. The project accomplished those objectives.

Improved Distribution of Streamflow Information via the Internet

The goal of this project was to give the Department the capability to provide more timely "real time" stream gaging data over the internet. That goal has been partially met in that real time data is now available internally for most stations. In the next year it is expected to also become available on the internet. Because of this project NDNR has upgraded Big Blue Basin gaging stations, two Platte River gaging stations, stations run by the DNR Norfolk office and stations run by the DNR Ord office to satellite data collection platforms, purchased data collection processing software and purchased software and a server to quickly aggregate and display stream gaging data in more useful graphical formats. There was additional training contracted for use of this software. This software has been adopted throughout the DNR field offices. DNR staff has also developed a system for integrating DNR and USGS gage records on the DNR site pending implementation of the real time effort. The major issue standing in the way of implementing a system for placing all data on the web in a near real time or at least once per day posting is integrating field office working and confirmation of records. This will be an agency focus in the coming year.

Equip DNR with Flow Measurement Equipment

In times of drought the number of calls for water administration increase and the objectives in obtaining new equipment included reducing the likelihood of miscalculations, providing more timely streamflow measurement, reduced checking time, easier data storage and uniformity of equipment. The purchase equipment helped in each of these regards. It included two Ultrasonic open channel flow meters, two dopler meters, four Aqua-Calcs, and one GPS camera for field office use.

Upgrade Gaging Equipment in Republican Basin

This equipment has been used to help in management of a basin that is implementing an interstate settlement and where accurate and timely measurement is very important. It is also a basin with significant Reclamation interests. Purchase included five satellite links for gages and materials for DNR staff to construct a walking bridge at the Cambridge gage and a ladder at the Medicine Creek gage.

Meter Cost Share for South Platte Natural Resources District

The objectives for this project included assisting landowners in better managing their water through meters and assisting in implementation of the District's Integrated Water Management Plan. Metering allows better management at all times but is especially important in drought years.

This was the final item in the entire grant agreement to be completed, with all other funds being expended by April 3, 2006 and the final meter on this project being billed on February 7, 2007. Billing to Reclamation needed to wait until the District was able to find landowners willing to take the cost share and begin the installation process. A total of 138 meters were installed at a program cost of \$100,000. This constituted 50% cost-share.

On-Site Computer Capabilities for Surface Water Distribution

This project provided NDNR field staff with laptop computer systems and accessories or PDAs to eliminate the burden of carrying maps, assist record keeping and reduce calculation errors. This enables more work to be done in the field. A total of 15 systems were purchased.

Place a New Gage on South Platte River Near Paxton

This particular gage has been placed in an important reach of a river subject to an interstate cooperative agreement. The data generated is likely to be very useful in future management, particularly in times of drought.

Update Drought Mitigation Plan

This plan was completed on _____ and copies were delivered to NDNR. Reclamation should already have copies of this plan, but if not, we can provide them.

B) Where Project Output Can be Quantified, A Compilation of the Cost Per Unit of Output

The one portion of the project most easily subject to this type of quantification is the South Platte meters project. A total of 98 records for 138 meters were paid for the \$100,000 project cost. This total program cost per meter was \$724.63. This constituted 50% cost-share. The expenditures table accompanying this report provided additional information on numbers of various types of equipment purchased as well as cost.

Other Pertinent Data

Because we were able to complete some portions of the grant at amounts less than originally anticipated, a request was made on November 3, 2005 to expend funds on similar but different items within the scope of the grant. That change was subsequently approved and the final categories and amounts included on the total expenditures chart reflect that change.
