## NEBRASKA EMERGENCY DROUGHT ASSISTANCE REPUBLICAN RIVER BASIN IRRIGATION DISTRICTS INCREASED RESERVOIR STORAGE CARRYOVER

### I. AUTHORITY

Drought assistance is being provided to the Nebraska Department of Natural Resources pursuant to section 102 of Title I as discussed under Section I. Authority in this cooperative agreement.

## II. BACKGROUND AND OBJECTIVE

Declining inflows throughout the Republican River Basin has significantly reduced storage supplies in Reclamation reservoirs in southwest Nebraska. This area has suffered effects of the current drought since 2000. Irrigation Districts in the Republican River Basin have been delivering reduced supplies and in 2003, 4 canal systems did not deliver any project water due to the drought conditions. In 2004, project delivery estimates for the 12 Reclamation project canal systems in the Nebraska portion of the Republican Basin Reservoirs range from 1 inch per acre to 8 inches per acre.

The declining inflows have resulted in declining reservoir storage, which causes problems like increases in noxious weeds and invasive species, declining fish habitat, decreased shoreline access, increased water temperatures, lower levels of dissolved oxygen, and reduced visitation. The Nebraska DNR would like to provide financial incentives to irrigation districts for leaving irrigation storage in the reservoirs.

Nebraska requested drought assistance in a May 5, 2004 letter from Governor Mike Johanns to Reclamation Commissioner John Keys. Nebraska was approved for drought assistance by the Commissioner's letter dated June 2, 2004.

The purpose of this attachment is to provide a mechanism for Reclamation to provide financial assistance through the Reclamation States Emergency Drought Relief Act to the Nebraska DNR for emergency drought assistance. The Nebraska DNR will provide financial incentives to the Republican River Basin Irrigation Districts for leaving limited 2004 irrigation storage in the reservoirs.

## III. PUBLIC BENEFIT

Assistance for leaving irrigation storage water for future years use will result in higher carryover reservoir levels, which will provide fish and wildlife and recreation benefits to the reservoir areas. The higher reservoir levels will reduce noxious weed and invasive species infestations, improve shoreline access, and increase visitation to the parks

surrounding these reservoirs. Higher reservoir levels also will keep water temperatures cooler and oxygen levels higher, which will be more beneficial to fish populations.

#### IV. STATEMENT OF WORK

#### A. The Nebraska DNR shall:

1. Enter into an agreement with the Republican River Basin Irrigation Districts in Nebraska (Frenchman Valley, H & RW, Frenchman-Cambridge, and Bostwick in Nebraska) in order to supply financial assistance to these Districts for leaving limited 2004 irrigation storage in the Republican Reservoirs (Swanson Lake, Enders Reservoir, Red Willow Lake, and Harlan County Lake), which will provide fish, wildlife, and recreation benefits.

#### B. Reclamation will

1. Provide funding assistance not to exceed \$151,500 to the Nebraska DNR for assistance to the Republican River Basin Irrigation Districts for leaving limited 2004 irrigation storage in the Republican Reservoirs, which will provide fish, wildlife, and recreation benefits.

#### XXI. BUDGET

Financial incentives were based on the March estimates of irrigation storage available at the Republican River Basin Reservoirs. A tiered reimbursement scheduled was developed that included a proposed payment of \$10.00 per AF of storage up to 2,500 AF, \$5.00 per AF of storage for the next 2,500 AF, and \$2.50 AF of storage above 5,000 AF.

The Bureau of Reclamation provided an estimated total irrigation supply in each reservoir as of March, 2004.

Last August I wrote to you concerning the possibility of Bureau assistance under both your Nebraska Investigations Program and under your Technical Assistance to States and Tribes Program. One of our requests on the Technical Assistance to States and Tribes Program was for Bureau work on "Assistance on Digital Mapping of Water Rights in the Republican Basin". The request at that time was for \$30,000 worth of assistance. We have recently held discussions both in-house and with Mike Kube and Fred Wood of your office concerning details of that potential assistance and I would like to formally request your assistance on that project at this time.

The specific assistance we request would be to have the Bureau:

- 1. Scan Land Area Sheets for the Frenchman-Cambridge Irrigation District
- 2. Register the scanned Land Area Sheets to an agreed map coordinate system
- 3. Vectorize the information on the scanned sheets
- 4. Supply personnel to field verify what is irrigated in the District.

Once those activities are completed in the Frenchman-Cambridge District a further needed activity would be to conduct similar projects in each of the remaining Republican River Basin Irrigation Districts. The order of priority for overall work (should it prove possible under your Technical Assistance Program) would be as follows:
