#### Travel Plan for Water Policy Task Force Tour Bridgeport to Scottsbluff

From Bridgeport travel west on Highway 92 along the south side of the North Platte River viewing several of the canals and drains located in this area.

At the Highway 92 and Highway 26 Junction south of Bayard, turn north crossing the North Platte River and passing through the city of Bayard. North of Bayard Highway 26 continues to the west. Here we will pass by the Wildhorse Drain, Nine Mile Creek and the Minatare Drain.


At Minatare we will turn north on Stonegate Road, crossing over the Minatare Mutual Canal and the Farmer's Irrigation District Canal. We will travel through some of the irrigated areas of the Farmers' and Pathfinder Irrigation Districts. We will also see the Alliance Drain.

We will stop at the Lighthouse Point at Lake Minatare to view the Lake and have a refreshment break. Pathfinder Irrigation District will provide the refreshments.

From Lake Minatare, if time permits we will travel west via county roads passing by Winters Creek Lake, Little Lake Alice and Lake Alice.

From Lake Alice we will travel south and west via county roads to Highway 71 viewing the Tub Springs Drain. Traveling south on Highway 71 towards Scottsbluff, we will pass through Pathfinder's lands and once again pass over the Farmer's Irrigation Canal and also the Enterprise Irrigation canal.

Arrive at the hotel in Scottsbluff for the night.
