GROUNDWATER TRANSFERS

- 1. NRDs with Groundwater Management Areas should be given primary authority, supplemental to that of the state, to issue and administer permits for:
 - a. temporary physical transfers of withdrawn groundwater from one location to another for any beneficial use,
 - b. permanent physical transfers of withdrawn groundwater from one location to another for any beneficial use,
 - c. temporary transfers of the point of withdrawal for the right to use groundwater for any beneficial use, and
 - d. permanent transfers of the point of withdrawal for the right to use groundwater for any beneficial use.
- 2. If the NRD finds that the transfer of groundwater requested by the applicant is:
 - a. reasonable,
 - b. not contrary to the conservation and beneficial use of groundwater,
 - c. not contrary to the District's Groundwater Management Plan,
 - d. are consistent with all applicable statutes, rules, and regulations, decrees, compacts, and other State Agreements,
 - e. not detrimental to an adjoining NRD, and
 - f. not otherwise detrimental to the public welfare,
 - g. and, if in an integrated management area, is not detrimental to a surface water right;

it shall grant a permit to the applicant to withdraw and transport groundwater in the amount applied for or in a lesser amount.

- 3. NRD may establish rules and regulations restricting or governing:
 - a. transfers of water within District,
 - b. transfers of water out of District, whether in-state or out-of-state
 - c. transfers of water into District,
 - d. transfers of use within District,
 - e. transfers of use out of District, whether in-state or out-of-state
 - f. transfers of use into District.
- 4. In regulating, restricting or governing temporary or permanent transfers an NRD may:
 - a. limit the distance the water or use may be transferred,
 - b. limit the locations where water can be transferred from or to,
 - c. limit the amounts of water or use that may be transferred,
 - d. require that permanent transfers of use of water be accompanied by decommissioning a well, and
 - e. require an offset of water use as a condition of the permits,
 - f. limit the timing of a withdrawal for transfer,
 - g. require measurement and reporting of withdrawal for transfer,
 - h. require such other regulations or restrictions as may be necessary.
- 5. The applicant requesting transfers of groundwater shall show evidence that the transfer is:
 - a. not detrimental to an adjoining NRD, and
 - b. not otherwise detrimental to the public welfare.

c. and, if in an integrated management area, is not detrimental to surface water rights.
