Attached is one possible suggestion for fixing the surveying/mapping problem that we identified as being in possible conflict with the Registered Land Surveyors. I think it would be much more palatable to do something like this rather then open up their section of statutes to create a fix. There may be other possibilities also.

Department of Natural Resources; powers; surveys of streams. The Department of Natural Resources may make surveys of streams showing the location of possible water power developments and irrigation projects: identify and map tracts of land to be served with water for irrigation or other beneficial purposes; and identify and map tracts of land involved in water rights transfers. Employees of the Department of Natural Resources shall not be required to be licensed as a Registered Land Surveyor under Sections 81-8,108 through 81-8,127 or comply with the provisions of such Sections in the performance of their duties under this Section or in the performance of their duties under Chapter 46, Article 2.
