Request for Information on Natural Resources District Funding Needs for

Integrated Water Management Activities


As you know, last year the legislature did not provide any funding for the NRDs or DNR to implement their integrated management responsibility for the second year of this biennial budget. The DNR is currently working with the Water Policy Task Force to obtain funding for these activities. Toward this end the funding subcommittee of the Task Force has asked us to assemble information on potential budgetary needs for integrated water management activities over the next several fiscal years. We are especially concerned that funds be available to help natural resources districts implement integrated water management activities under LB 962. In that regard we are sending this memo to all district managers asking for their assistance by providing their potential integrated management related costs and funding assistance needs for FY's 06-07, 07-08, and 08-09.

If all or a portion of your district has already been determined to be fully appropriated or designated as overappropriated, please provide us with your best estimate of the budget you will need to carry out your districts integrated management planning responsibilities. At this time the Department has not determined which, if any, additional areas of the state will be declared fully appropriated before January 1, 2006. If, however, a part of your NRD should be determined to be fully appropriated, you will no doubt incur additional operation costs. Even though your basin may not be considered as fully appropriated, in order to insure we request sufficient funding to cover all potential additional costs, we request that you provide us with estimates based upon a hypothetical determination of your basin being fully appropriated. For those districts that are not currently designated as fully appropriated, we would also like an estimate of what expenses, if any, your district might incur related to integrated management planning assuming you are not determined to be fully appropriated.

To assist districts with budget planning we have attached a supplementary item or items depending upon the district. These are separate budget sheets for Districts with overappropriated / Republican River Compact basins, fully appropriated basins and basins which

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have not been declared. Each budget includes our initial rough estimates for a hypothetical general basin only. These estimates were based upon conversations with NRD personnel and others. These may provide an initial guide, but will not fit the actual circumstances of your District: We would like you to fill in the amounts as appropriate for your district in the columns for each fiscal year. Some districts may contain both fully and overappropriated areas and in those situations we would suggest using the overappropriated budget sheet for the entire district.

We currently anticipate trying to maintain or increase State support for University research and assistance and DNR staff assistance to NRDs. The current funding for the 05-06 and 06-07 biennium for integrated water management activities includes a \$7.5 million appropriation plus a \$1.1 million carryover. We plan on using \$5 million of that amount for the Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program funding in designated areas of the Platte and Republican Basins. We have also set aside \$1 million in relation to integrated management for the EQIP program. Your responses to this memo will help us to understand the needed level of funds both in the second year of the current biennium and for the following two fiscal years.

There is some urgency to receiving your response in a timely manner. The Funding Subcommittee of the Nebraska Water Policy Task Force is meeting September 8<sup>th</sup> and their Chair would like to see whatever figures we receive from the NRDs at that time. That subcommittee will be helping the task force, which meets on October 8, develop its specific recommendations on future funding needs and means of raising funding. Those recommendations will in turn be provided to the DNR as input in developing the upcoming state budget for integrated water management activities. Therefore, we need your best estimates for the budget by the close of business on Friday, September 2. Thank you for any help you are able to provide on this important budgetary topic. We want to have the best idea possible of natural resources district's upcoming budgetary needs for integrated water management activities. The information should help provide a basis for better budgetary decisions and requests in upcoming months.
